## **Introducing the Blue Mountain Watershed Trust Foundation**

The 2021 census revealed, perhaps not surprisingly, that a growing number of Canadians are moving to smaller municipalities and in particular calling resort destinations home.

South Georgian Bay communities rank among the fastest growing in Canada, and this growth will continue with our populations expanding by another 60% by 2041.

How will we accommodate all this growth? How do we protect the natural beauty and fragile ecosystem of this place we now call home?

The Blue Mountain Watershed Trust Foundation (the Watershed Trust), Ontario's first watershed trust, was formed in 1994 to protect natural areas in Collingwood and the Blue Mountains from development pressures of many kinds. They have been instrumental in preserving and protecting our remaining wild places. Their area of interest totals approximately 50,000 hectares.
